Junior Achievement of Arkansas Announces Inaugural Hall of Fame Gala
Jenny and Andrew Faulkner to co-chair new event on May 9 in Little Rock

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (Feb. 7, 2024) — Junior Achievement of Arkansas has announced its inaugural Hall of Fame Gala, to be co-chaired by Jenny and Andrew Faulkner, CEO of Staley Technologies, the event's presenting sponsor. The celebration will be Thursday, May 9, 2024, at the Statehouse Convention Center Governor Halls I and II in Little Rock.
